The Department of Urban-Global Public Health at the Rutgers School of Public Health has an opening for an assistant professor, tenure track, with expertise in urban and/or global public health. We are open to candidates with a wide range of scholarly interests that are salient to urban and/or global public health including but not limited to immigration, migration, poverty, violence prevention, mental health, nutrition, environment/climate change, sexual and reproductive health. We seek an individual with a program of research informed by implementation science, clinical trials, observational studies, and through the application and testing of innovative technologies and methodologies. We seek a creative faculty member who is motivated to understand and improve public health through scholarship, service, and policy development; has the potential to develop and sustain an extramurally funded research program; contribute actively to the teaching mission using modern pedagogical techniques; and mentor MPH and doctoral students.

The successful candidate also must hold current NIH funding in the form of a K or R. Those without such an award would be considered at the level of Instructor leading to the position of Assistant Professor.

The faculty member will be primarily appointed to the Department of Urban-Global Public Health, chaired by Dr. Leslie Kantor.

Under the leadership of the new Dean, Perry N. Halkitis, The Rutgers School of Public Health is undergoing dynamic and transformative growth, including the addition of multiple faculty members this year. The Rutgers School of Public Health is devoted to employing an innovative, interdisciplinary model, which aims to improve health locally, domestically and worldwide through a unique blend of public health research, practice, and education.

The CEPH-accredited Rutgers School of Public Health offers multiple master and doctoral degrees, dual-degree, certificate, and articulated BA/BS-MPH degree programs. Applicants will find a wide range of collaborative experts within the School (sph.rutgers.edu) and Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences (RBHS; rbhs.rutgers.edu), including

the Cancer Institute of New Jersey (cinj.org), the Institute for Health, Health Care Policy, and Aging Research (ihhpar.rutgers.edu), and the Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences Institute (eohsi.rutgers.edu). Rutgers is a leading national research university and New Jersey's preeminent public institution of higher education. Chartered in 1776 as Queen's College, it is the eighth oldest higher education institution in the United States and a member of the AAU, the Big Ten and the CIC. Rutgers is comprised of Rutgers University-New Brunswick, Rutgers University-Newark, Rutgers University-Camden, and arching over all three locations, Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences. Rutgers is located at the center of the Boston to Washington, DC corridor, with access to New York, Philadelphia, and the Atlantic Ocean beaches within an hour.

The position will be based in Newark, NJ although SPH also has official work sites located in Piscataway/New Brunswick and Camden so travel between campuses is expected. A robust mentoring program exists within the school for faculty. An attractive recruitment package will include a competitive salary and start-up funds. Successful applicants will have a doctoral degree or equivalent, a demonstrated record of scholarship appropriate to an assistant professor rank, and the potential to develop and sustain extramural grant support.

The PhD program was ranked No. 1 in the USA in 2015 by the National Association of Kinesiology, and the undergraduate program is one of the largest with 1150 majors. The Department is home to 30 faculty members whose research and outreach programs are funded by a broad range of federal agencies, private entities, and philanthropic organizations. Several faculty members are nationally and internationally recognized for their research acumen and professional accomplishments.

The Department of Exercise Science is a central contributor to the Arnold School of Public Health's research mission, and the School is a University leader in scholarship with over \$30 million in annual research funding. The successful candidate will have demonstrated a high level of scholarly achievement, an established record of research funding, teaching excellence, and professional leadership commensurate with a tenured academic appointment at full rank. In addition, the individual will be an established academic leader who can facilitate faculty, staff, and student development and build collaborations with intramural and extramural partners. Qualifications include an earned doctorate in exercise science, kinesiology, physical therapy, athletic training, or related discipline.

The University of South Carolina is located in Columbia, the state capital and the center of a metropolitan area that is home to over 800,000 residents. Columbia is situated in the center of the state, approximately 100 miles from both the Atlantic coast and foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The Columbia area offers a wide range of cultural and recreational resources including Lake Murray, Riverbanks Zoo, Congaree National Monument, Koger Center for the Performing Arts, the SC State Museum, and the EdVenture Children's Museum. The climate is sub-tropical featuring long, temperate falls and springs; warm and humid summers; and short, mild winters.

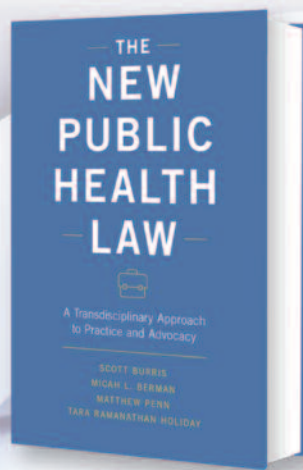
